# **Course Description**

This course considers selected major philosophical texts from nineteenth century continental Europe. Although some consideration will be given in the classes to historical context and to philosophical predecessors and successors, both the classes and the assignments will be devoted, above all, to examining the philosophical arguments and concerns of the three selected texts.

## **Required Texts**

- 3. Friedrich Nietzsche, Beyond Good and Evil. Trans. Walter Kaufmann. Vintage, 1989.

### **Course Requirements**

- 1. First essay: 1000 words. Due on Feb. 11, and worth 25% of final grade.
- 2. Second essay: 1000 words. Due on March 10, and worth 25% of final grade.
- 3. Third essay: 1200 words. Due on April 15 (in the drop-box), and worth 30% of final grade.
- 4. In-class presentation: 1000 words. Worth 10% of final grade. See D2L for instructions.
- 5. Class Participation: Worth **10%** of final grade. (This grade will be based on constructive contributions to class discussions.)

# There will be no Registrar-scheduled final exam.

Letter grades will be given. Those grades will be based on the following numerical system: A = 90-100%; A = 85-89%; A = 80-84%; B + = 77-79; B = 74-76; B - = 70-73; C + = 67-69; C = 64-66; C - = 60-63; D + = 55-59; D = 50-54; F = 0-49. If the final grade is fractional, it will be rounded off to the higher full number only if it is .5 or higher (e.g. 69.5 would become 70, 69.49 would not).

Late papers will receive a grade reduction (A to A-, A- to B+, and so on) unless an extension has been negotiated before the deadline. A paper submitted after an extended deadline will be subject to the same policy of grade reduction. **No papers will be accepted after the final grades have been submitted to the Department and the Registrar.** Papers may be submitted directly to the instructor or left in the labelled drop-box for the course (in the main hall of the PHIL department, 12<sup>th</sup> floor Soc. Sci. Bldg.).
