Course Description

In this seminar you will work on forming and developing your ideas for your honours thesis through the writing and presenting of multiple drafts of your thesis work. You will do the work for this course in conjunction with your larger project of working with your honours supervisor on your honours thesis.

Course Requirements

There will be no Registrar Scheduled Final exam. Evaluation of writing is an important component of the grade in this class. No component is such that passing it is required to pass the course. Students are expected to attend all class sessions and to participate as interlocutors in the presentations given by their fellow students.

First Presentation—Sept. 29 (5%)

Second Presentation—Oct. 20 or 27(20%)

Final Presentation— Dec. 8 (20%)

Final Draft (15 page minimum) of Thesis Work— due in D2L dropbox by 23:59 Dec. 9 (50%)

Writing Support Services assist with a variety of assignments, from essays to lab reports. Students can book 30-minute one-on-one appointments online, sign up for 15-minute drop-in appointments, and register for a variety of
