**Course Description**

This course introduces formal languages and proof procedures for sentential and predicate logic. The final grade will be determined by 4 in class tests and 3 assignments. Questions on tests and assignments will be similar to the exercise questions in the course text. All assignments will be submitted into a drop-box located in the department of philosophy (12<sup>th</sup> floor of Social Sciences) by 4 PM on the dates they are due. **Assignments will not be accepted via email.** Missed in class tests and late assignments will be assigned a grade of zero unless a university approved justification is promptly provided. There is no registrar-scheduled final exam for this course.
