Course Description

The world of business involves relations between different groups of individuals. This world has stockholders, board members, corporate managers, employees, suppliers, customers and those in the local community of a corporation. Since the actions, and policies governing the actions, of individuals in one group will impact those in other groups, it is open to us to morally evaluate such actions and policies. For instance is it permissible for, or perhaps even a duty of, corporate managers to serve only the interests of stockholders? Does an employee have an obligation to reveal corporate wrongdoing? Do corporations have a duty to refrain from destroying the environment? This course will address such issues. The final grade will be determined by two in class tests and one take home test. The tests involve writing essays on assigned topics. A drop box will be set up in the Philosophy Department (12th floor, Social Science Building) for you to submit your take home test. **Take home tests will not be accepted via email under any circumstances.** Missed in class tests and late take home tests will be assigned a grade of zero unless a university approved justification is promptly provided. There is no registrar-scheduled final exam for this course.
