Course Description

What makes science unique from other forms of inquiry? What kinds of inquiry are genuinely scientific? How are scientific theories justified? How can we know whether a scientific theory is true? We will be looking at philosophical discussion of these and others questions about science. The course topics correspond to the following sections of the required text:

Weeks 1 and 2

Section 1: Science and Pseudoscience

Weeks 3 and 4

Section 2: Rationality, Objectivity, and Values in Science

Weeks 5 and 6

Section 9: Empiricism and Scientific Realism

Evaluation and Grading

The final course grade will be based on:

- A take-home test due July 16, worth 30% of the final grade;
- A paper proposal (roughly one page) due July 25, worth 10% of the final grade;
- An in-class test on July 30, worth 30% of the final grade;
- A final paper (2,500 words max) on a topic of your choosing (subject to approval) due August 13 and worth 30% of the final grade.

There is <u>no</u> Registrar-scheduled final exam for this course.

Students may, in principle, fail any one of the required components and still pass the course.
