Course Description

This course will focus on Nietzsche's philosophy and include some of his most seminal texts. We will also discuss the contemporary relevance and influence of Nietzsche's ideas.

Prerequisites:

Two previous courses in Philosophy, one of which must be *PHIL 309, 311, 333 or 359*.

Course Learning Outcomes

Students will read difficult, complex books that they are unlikely to understand upon first reading. Class participation is therefore essential.

Students should learn to ask probing questions and also to articulate the main aspects of arguments with which they may disagree. In other words, before one begins a critique, one should understand what one is criticizing.

Students should learn to write grammatically correct, coherent, and clearly written interpretive papers.

Course Assessment

- Class Participation and seminar presentation: 15%
- Essay 1 (approximately 1800-2000 words) 45% **Due October 30**
- Take home examination (approximately 1800-2000 words) : 40% **Due November 27**

All assignments must be completed to pass the course. Essays should be handed in to me at the beginning of the class on the day it is due. There will be a late penalty of 3% a day for the essay. Take-home examinations must be handed in at the beginning of class on the day it is due. *As this is a take-home examination, no late exam shall be accepted.*

You are expected to give a 15 minute presentation, and lead discussion for 10 minutes on any aspect of the readings for that class. I will allow for only one presentation per class.
