COURSE DESCRIPTION (FROM ACADEMIC CALENDAR)

Feminist theories help us understand why things are the way they are, and suggest useful strategies for appropriate social change. This course will critically consider contemporary approaches to feminist theorizing and their historical bases.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- To describe the historical contexts for multiple feminisms, feminist theories and social change.
- To differentiate the key concepts and authors for each feminist theory covered in the course.
- To analyse current gender issues using at least two feminist theories.

Reflection (10%) Due Oct. 3 – This assignment will give students the opportunity to provide a sample of their writing both for style and critical thinking skills. Consisting of 1-2 pages students will be required to provide a brief reflection on a gender issue of their choice and explain how one of the theories studied to date would address possible origins and solutions for social change.

In Class Exam (25%) Oct. 29

-Closed Book. 50 min. Questions will test fundamental theoretical concepts covered to date in the form of short paragraph responses.

<u>Analytic Paper (35%) Due Nov.14th</u> This assignment will require students to critically compare and contrast at least two feminist theories in relation to a list of suggested topics. Paper length 8 pages.

<u>Final Take Home Exam (30%) Due Dec. 12th</u> Questions for this exam will be given out 2 weeks in advance of the due date. Questions will consist of short paragraph form and one short essay.

It is the student's responsibility to keep a copy of each submitted assignment.

Note: Please hand in your essays directly to your instructor. If it is not possible to do so, a daytime drop box is available in SS 102. A night drop box is also available for after-hours submission. Assignments will be removed from this drop box at 8:30 each morning and stamped with the date that the assignment is removed from the drop box, and then placed in the instructor's mailbox.
