Dissertation Abstract: The evolutionary contingency thesis is a view about the nature of evolution that emphasizes change, impermanence, and lack of necessity in how evolution unfolds (Gould 1989, Beatty 1995, 2006, Desjardin 2011, and Turner 2010). Evolutionary contingency produces diverse biological entities, processes, and mechanisms. I argue that this diversity amounts to a pluralism. First there are a plurality of evolutionary individuality types that selection acts on, which emerge, evolve, and disappear over the course of evolution. Second, I defend a disunified model of major transitions in evolution because there are many kinds of major events in life's history. And finally, I address the nature of cancer. I argue that contingency provides an evolutionary reason for philosophers to focus on the structural differences among types of cancers, rather than just their functional similarities.
